Introduction to ISO 31000:2009 Risk Management

This Luncheon will provide a high-level overview of the CAN/CSA ISO 31000 Risk Management – Principles and Guidelines. It will briefly introduce the 11 risk management principles upon which the Standard is based. In addition, it will address why it is important to have an international standard for risk management.

ISO SPEAKER

Nicki Dennis is a publishing and standards consultant. She has been living and working in Canada for 3 years. Before moving to Canada she was the Head of Risk Market Development at BSI, the National Standards Body for the UK. Her job involved finding and developing best practice in any area of risk management and building consensus around it through the development of standards and associated products. Nicki represented the UK standards community on two European committees, 'Risk Assessment' and 'Protection & Security of the Citizen'. She was also part of the UK delegation to the ISO 31000 Risk Management working group.

Nicki has a first degree in Statistics and Geography, a Masters degree in Urban Planning and an MBA. Her background is 20 years in scientific and technical publishing and she has been a publishing director responsible for publishing academic and professional books, journals, newsletters and websites in subjects including architecture, construction, economics, engineering, physics and statistics. These projects ranged in level from undergraduate textbooks to research level texts and encyclopaedias. Outside of work, Nicki is a qualified senior hockey coach and on the board of the charity BeatBullying. She is still trying to get to grips with the Canadian winter.
